



Your journey from hospital to home

Where will I live?

Brightwater Marangaroo is located in a quiet residential area north of Perth. There are 23 rooms across four recently renovated houses where you can feel comfortable and at home.


- Private bedrooms, which you can personalise, with ensuite bathrooms
- Shared living and kitchen areas
- Beautiful outdoor areas
- Communal clubhouse



Am I eligible?

You need to be:

- Referred from a Perth metropolitan public hospital
- Medically ready for discharge from hospital
- Working towards the goal of moving into community living with supports
- Aged 16 64 years
- Eligible for funding through the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) or other funding



How do I apply?

- 1. Ask your hospital social worker to submit a referral to Brightwater
- 2. We will then assess your eligibility for our program
- 3. If you are eligible, we will talk to you and your family about what is provided in the program and if we can meet your expectations




What **support** will I get?

- Key therapist as the go-to person for you and your family
- 24/7 access to enrolled nurses and support workers
- Allied health supports and registered nurses on weekdays
- Goals that are individual to you
- Regular reviews of your goals
- Option to top up your services with your NDIS plan



What does **life** look like at Marangaroo?

- Opportunity to participate in:
 - Onsite skill building groups
 - Celebrations and special events
 - Support to work on rebuilding daily living routines
- Flexible visiting arrangements for family and friends
- Onsite cook
- Spaces for privacy and quiet time
- Opportunity to socialise with other clients onsite
- Access to services onsite to support mental health and wellbeing
- Access to wifi and opportunity to trial smart technology



How long will I stay?

The length of your stay will depend on your readiness for discharge, an appropriate NDIS plan, available suitable accommodation and support providers.


While everyone's journey is different, we don't expect you to stay longer than a year.

To get you ready to leave, our team will work with your NDIS providers to ensure a smooth transition to your new home.



How much does it **cost**?

- You are required to pay Brightwater a daily fee that is for board and lodgings. This fee is 75% of the Disability Support Pension as well as Rent Assistance, Pension Supplement and Energy Supplement.
- You will also need to pay for toiletries, clothing and medication. If you choose to cook some of your own meals, you will need to pay for those groceries.
